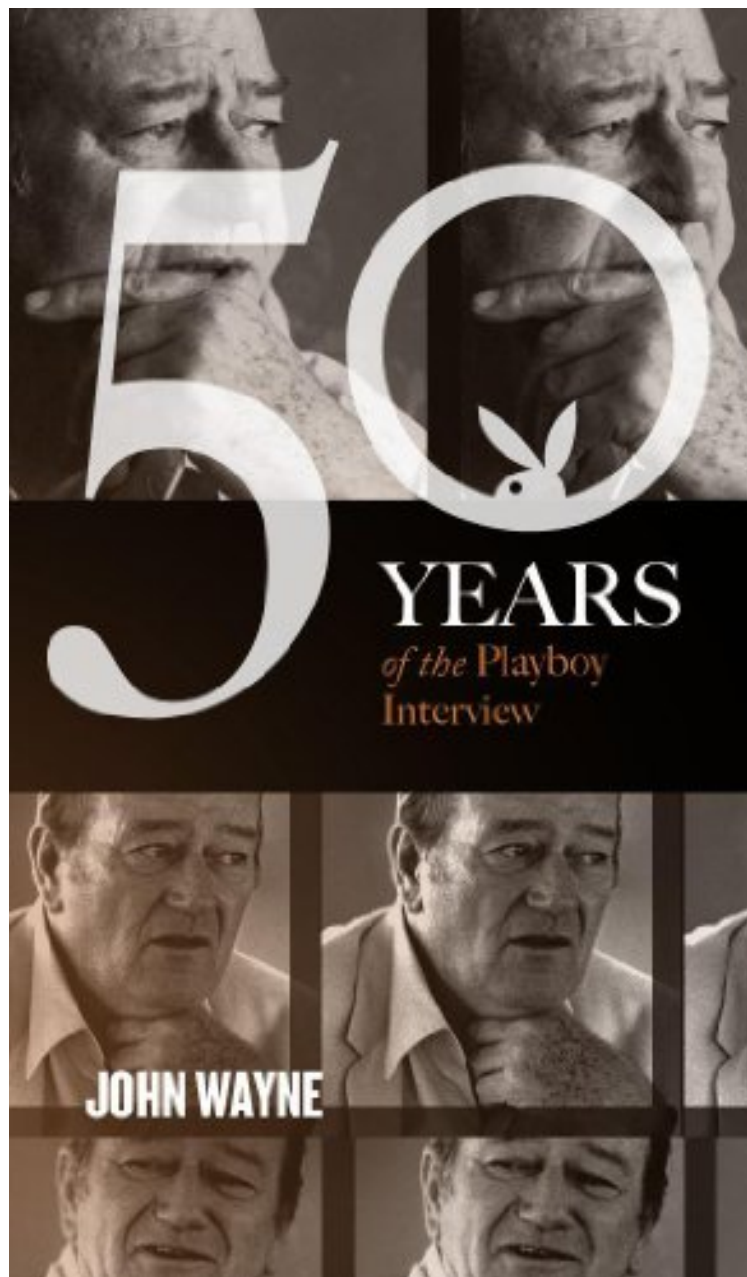

Auf leider zu wenigen Seiten (knapp 30) beginnt das Interview recht interessant, wird gegen Ende hingegen aber deutlich eindimensionaler. Obwohl ich Wayne als sympathischen Schauspieler betrachte, ist das Interview entlarvend: Wayne vertritt lang und breit (zu lang, zu breit) seine ultra-konservativen Ansichten zum Vietnam-Krieg, zum Kommunismus, etc. Das Playboy-Interview wirft ein anderes Licht auf John Wayne; und zwar kein gutes. Gut also, dass Wayne nicht - wie im Interview angesprochen - sein Glück in der Politik versucht hat. Insgesamt vier Sterne, weil das Interview zwar interessant ist, es dem Journalisten aber nur bedingt gelingt, ein halbwegs umfassendes Bild von Wayne zu zeichnen. Diese Problematik wird möglicherweise durch den eher geringen Seitenansatz verstärkt. Für Fans durchaus ein Kann, aber sicherlich kein Muss.
