different enough to make this one a very engaging story too. It's both a fun and emotional road trip story, but I was missing some more depth, another layer. The humor worked, and was the principal difference when comparing the book to "Everything I Never Told You" by Celeste Ng. It's basically a story about three kids who goof around with each other. It's very fun to read, but I'm afraid the balance tips too much to this humorous side. The more emotional stuff could have been a bit more worked out. The emotional scenes, primarily about grief, are there, but the characters go back to their goofy selves way too fast afterwards. It was a very enjoyable read, and the characters are very sympathetic, but it read more as a movie script than a novel. In that regard, I wanted to know more about those characters. I wanted to get to know them better than simply what's shown in these pages. Probably because they are such good friends; I wanted to join their circle. (Or triangle. Making it a square then. Whatever.)
