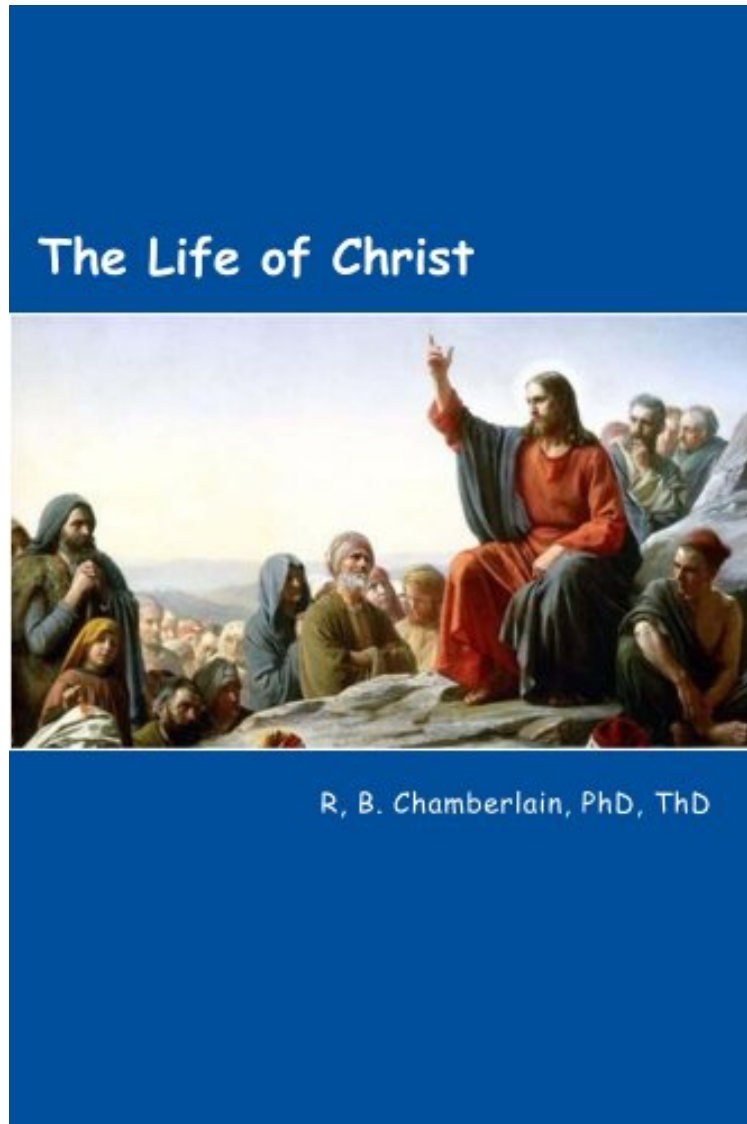

Der Autor und weitere Mitwirkende R B Chamberlain (Bob) spent 30 years in middle management in the Aircraft Engine business of one of America's largest industrial businesses. During this time, he pursued formal education that led to a PhD in Cultural Anthropology (with a concentration in Comparative Religions) and a ThD (with a concentration in Christian Apologetics). He teaches World Religions at Brevard Community College (Florida), and has had a life-long interest in religion and theology; his particular field of interest falls within the field of New Religious Movements. Over his life-time, he has formally been a member of 3 different faith traditions, and has been baptized (or the equivalent) by 6 different traditions. Philosophically, his view of religion is that expressed by Aristotle in the opening line of his classic text, *Metaphysics* - "All men by nature desire to know." This means that all texts should strive to provide the reader with more information by the end than they had at the outset, for only through exploring added information can we ever hope to learn, or to know.
