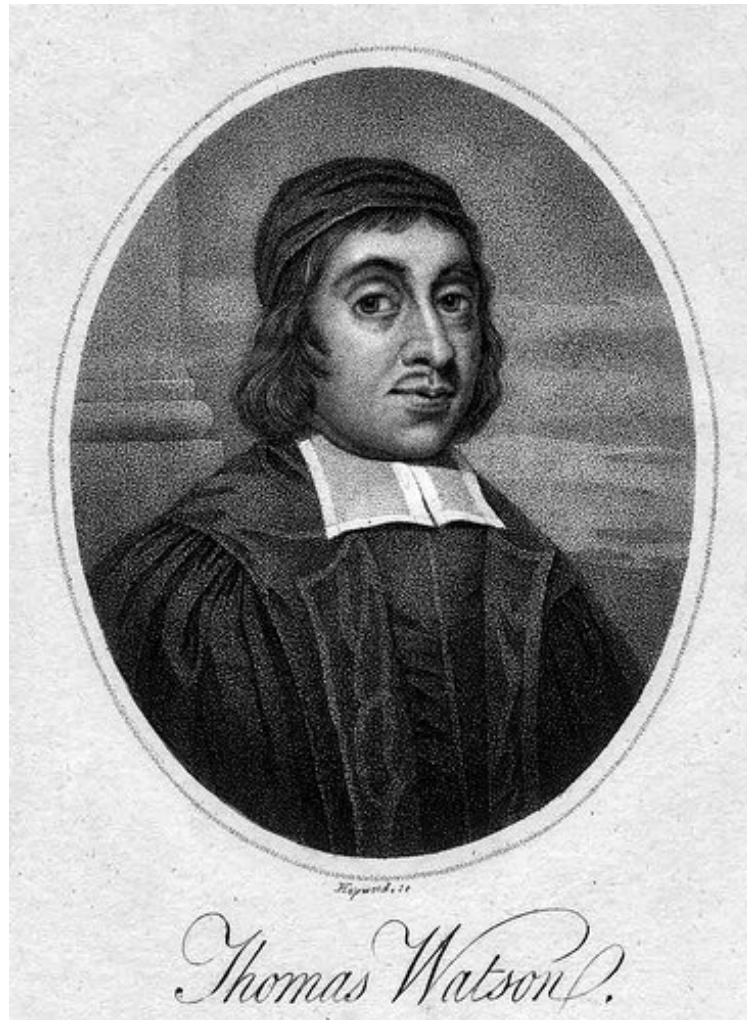

changed my view of prayer, proving the motivation of prayer needed not to be my own desires, but the glory of God.
