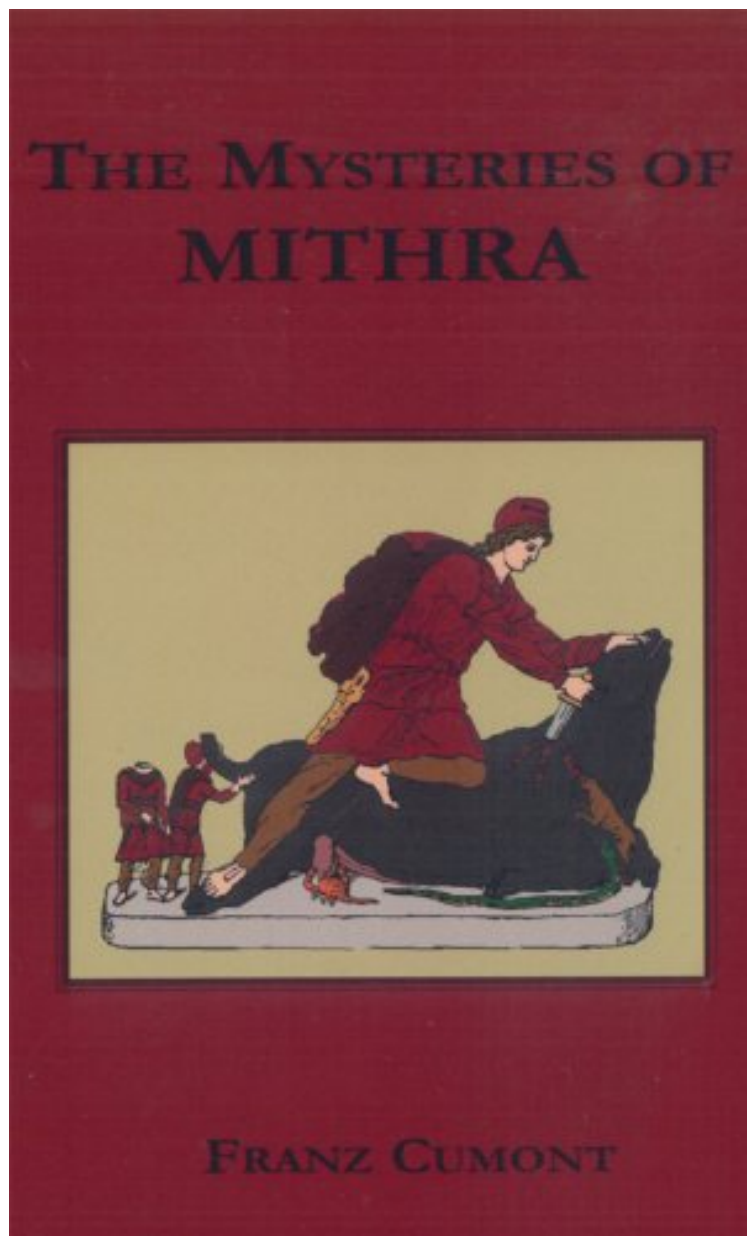

the book that started the modern interest in the Mithras-cult, and it is a must for anyone who wants to balance the more freaked-out stories of the cult. The author describes the cult of Mithras and points out most of the fundamental things that we know about it. Although many findings and theories have come since this book was written, it is still a good place to start if you want to read about this cult, or about mystery-religions in general. I liked the book because it gives a serious and sober account of the cult. Even though it is fairly old, it is a book against which other books on the same subject can be measured.
