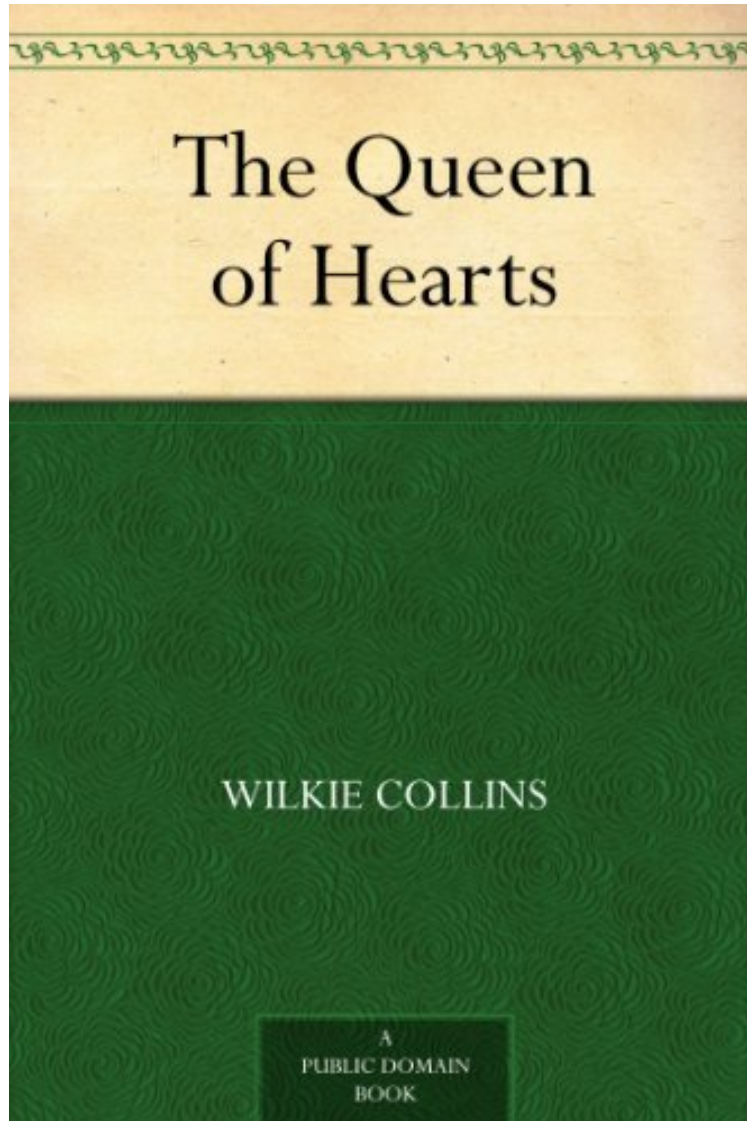

Die zweite Geschichte beschäftigt sich, wie der Titel ("The Family Secret") ahnen lässt, mit einem Familiengeheimnis. Die dritte Geschichte ("The Dream-Woman") enthält was ich als 'supernatural elements' bezeichnen würde. Die vierte und längste Geschichte ist eine

10 Stories" form the pricipal contents of" Wilkie Collins's book "The Queen of Hearts". The first story centres on an incident (a siege) in a rural area. The second story deals, as the title ("The Family Secret") suggests, with a family secret. The third story ("The Dream-Woman") contains what I would call supernatural elements. The fourth and longest story is a creepy tale of a young man who is obsessed with an old prophecy. "The Dead Hand" is an atmospheric and suspenseful story about a 'strange event'. "The Biter Bit", the sixth story, is comic/satirical. "The Parson's Scruple" is a somewhat tragic domestic story. "A Plot in Private Life" deals, as the title suggests, with a plot and contains also elements of the detective genre. "Fauntleroy", the penultimate story, is about friendship. The "Story of Anne Rodway", a diary form narrative, is a moving tale of a young woman who investigates the death of her friend. I like some stories more than others. But judge for yourself ..And I particularly like the frame narrative, which centres on a spirited girl, three old men and a young man. 3 1/2 stars
